THREE METHODS FOR COMPLETING YOUR DEGREES

The Theological University of America is a distant learning school. The Theological University of America offers you the choice of three methods of completing your degrees:

The Regents Validation Degree Program - You may complete your Bachelors of Ministry, Master of Ministry and Doctor of Ministry through a combination of your prior education and prior ministerial experience without completing additional courses. If your credentials total 120 credit hours, you have earned your Bachelor's degree. If your credentials total 36 credits beyond the Bachelor's degree, you have earned your Master's degree. If your credentials total 36 credit beyond the Master's degree, you have earned your Doctorate of Ministry.

The Experiential Learning Degree Program - You may complete your Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Ministry, your Master of Arts, Master of Ministry, or Master of Divinity, your Doctor of Ministry or Doctor of Philosophy through the activities of your current ministry. The Experiential Learning Degree Program is a "hands-on" program.

The Distant Learning Degree Program - You earn your required

credits through specific, traditional courses by correspondence which involves textbooks, research, readings, papers, and projects. You can complete all the Bachelor, Master, and Doctorate degree programs offered by the Theological University of America through the Distant Learning Degree Program.

UNDERGRADUATE DIVISION

The student may substitute any course of comparable subject and content for any TUA course listed below.

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Ministry Degree

The requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree are divided into four sections: General Education, Foundation Courses, Major, and Minor/Elective Field Courses.

MAJOR/ELECTIVE FIELDS REQUIREMENTS

Major Field requirements may vary from 30 to 60 credits.
Minor/Elective Field requirements may vary from 6 to 30 credits.
(Exceptions to the Major/Minor/Elective Field credit distribution will depend on the student academic needs and the Dean's approval.)
